Looking Forward into 2022-2023 and Beyond

Since our school is located in an agricultural region surrounded by natural parks and rivers, and since we already have an incredible greenhouse, Barrowtown wants to incorporate an agriculture/outdoor aspect into our teaching goals. Mrs. Basran has spoken with Nathan, our assistant superintendent, and he is very supportive to help us along in this process. It is unknown whether this will be an official choice school niche, or if it will be a grassroots movement that is incorporated into our everyday BC curriculum. Outdoor and agriculture learning is becoming very popular in preschool, homeschool, elementary and secondary schools in our province, nation and around the world, so this could be something valuable to families who want this type of learning for their children. It could also help attract more families to Barrowtown. Whether it is official or grassroots, a priority will be for students to have an understanding of sustainable agriculture and environmental stewardship.

Greenhouse and Gardening

- The Greenhouse is in full bloom, and the teachers and students alike are enjoying working in there.
- A Vancouver Trauma Support Group wanted to donate \$1200 to Barrowtown Elementary for flood relief, and Mrs. Basran thought it would be great to use it towards fixing up, maintaining and improving our garden and greenhouse areas. VTSG has already purchased garden soil, a composter and shovels for Barrowtown. The remaining money will go towards materials for garden boxes, a Butterfly and Bee Garden, a pumpkin patch, and corn patch. THANK YOU, VTSG!!!

- Mr. Treliving has volunteered to build the garden boxes for Barrowtown. THANK YOU, MR. TRELIVING!
- BC Agriculture will also come to the school to give more gardening lessons for teachers and students.
- Other programs to look into:
 - Learning for Sustainability
 - Gardening and tree planting grant for \$500
 - Apply by April 8
 - Hatch-a-Chick Program

Grade 5 Plant Fundraiser – May 6,7

New Business

It was suggested by PAC that since Barrowtown intends to focus on outdoor learning, maybe it is time to fundraise for a covered area for shade and rain protection. This is something that the school has already approached the school district about, and that there are certain requirements for a covered area. One of the main requirements is that a district rule does not allow for structures to have a full roof, to prevent people from living under them. Structures can only have open roofs, like a pergola. The reasons behind this rule does not seem to fit in our school setting, as there are not many people wandering the Barrowtown area without a home. Items left on the playground are safe all weekend, and no one disturbs them, as evidence that a full roof structure would not be misused by the public. So Barrowtown will continue to talk about this with the school district, to find out if these same requirements are necessary for Barrowtown. If it cannot be swayed, then one idea would be to cover a pergola with grape vines to create shade. And that would also further the outdoor and agriculture learning goals.
