Start Up and Staffing

Gym Remediation Project

The gym is being redone due to the flood. The foundational work should be done in late November, and the new gym floor will be complete upon the company's schedule. Hopefully that will be around mid December. Until then, gym is being held outside.

Child Care Student and Family Affordability Fund

SD34 has allotted \$1355 to our school for this year only to help support families in need of food, school supplies, school fees, and/or clothing.
